FXB India Suraksha (FXBIS) is an Indian non-governmental, non-profit organization providing development assistance to marginalized children, women, and communities in rural and urban India. Since inception, the organization has had a special focus for children, especially those from marginalized communities and the HIV/AIDS infected or affected children. To address the needs of children comprehensively, FXBIS follows an '**Integrated Development**' approach model, wherein it designs programmes on livelihood, health and education for the community as a whole, so that the vulnerable, especially women and children are provided a safe, healthy and sustainable environment to thrive in. Our four domains of interventions, namely, Livelihood Promotion, Access to Quality Education, Improved Health Status, and Protection & Safety, together exert to create a net of protection and welfare in the community we intervene.

FXBIS began its operations in 2007, as a registered Indian entity under Section 8 of the Companies Act 1956, modified under section 8 of the Companies Act, 2013 with an objective of assisting people to lead a life of dignity by creating safe, healthy and productive environment. It is currently working in the states of Delhi, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Jharkhand, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal and 1 UT, Puducherry.



Dear Readers

I wish to take this opportunity to present to you FXBIS's Annual Report for 2021-2022



FXB India Suraksha's commitment to reduce vulnerability and empower women and children from marginalized communities motivate us for developing innovative solutions and consistently working towards their impact at scale. Keeping this commitment at the core of our work, we delivered cost effective, break through interventions last year. This year, FXB India Suraksha has completed 15 years of directly working with marginalized communities to lead a life of dignity by creating safe, healthy and productive environment.

In 2021-2022, FXB India Suraksha directly reached out to more than 200000 population in 12 states through its interventions on Health, Education, Livelihoods and Protection and Safety for Women and Children. Our efforts to improve earnings of marginalized rural women took a big leap as through our programmes, we have engaged more than 2000 women in improved livestock management and helped about 100 women farmers to earn consistent incomes through vegetable production and marketing as part of our model kitchen garden farming program in Assam and Meghalaya.

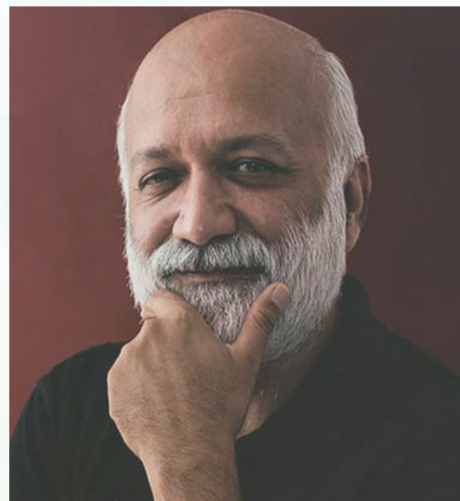

DOMAINS OF WORK

LIVELIHOOD PROMOTION



FXB India Suraksha envisions an India in which women and families lead self-reliant and empowered lives of dignity. With this vision, FXBIS has been enabling skill-based employment opportunities for women and youth and strengthened individual and community-based capacities to run and grow the businesses.

FXBIS focuses on reviving traditional livelihood avenues using local resources and transference of technology. Women members of the FXBIS Self Help Groups (SHGs) participate in comprehensive training programmes which equip them with the skills to sustainably run their businesses. SHGs are linked with cooperatives, financial institutions and government schemes for micro-financing opportunities; besides the linkages with market opportunities for products and services facilitated by FXBIS state teams considering the regional nuances. In addition, FXBIS is helping farmers to access advance farm techniques, tools and equipment and increasing agricultural productivity and returns.

ACCESS TO QUALITY EDUCATION

FXB India Suraksha believes in universal access to quality education as the key to effective and sustainable social change. The FXBIS education strategy aims to enhance access to and the quality of education across socio-economic strata. We help local schools to improve their infrastructure and basic amenities besides helping families in need to raise funds for school education and we link them to government education schemes.

In the **20** Suraksha Education Centres spread across rural and urban slums in India, children can access supplementary educational support from trained local educated volunteers through innovative Teaching Learning Materials. FXBIS computer literacy Centres bridge the digital divide among the youth. FXBIS empowers women and youth through non-formal education programmes, 'Life Skill Workshops' and vocational training courses.



IMPROVED HEALTH STATUS



FXB India Suraksha recognizes that good health is a fundamental human right and a precondition for social development. A paramount objective of all FXBIS programmes is to address health vulnerabilities by improving access to quality health services, clean water and sanitation facilities within its intervention geographies.

The overall impact of the FXBIS health strategy is a significant decrease of communicable and vector borne diseases as well as infant, maternal and child mortality rates within communities of intervention. FXBIS' comprehensive health agenda includes direct support in form of health camps, care and support services for people living with HIV/AIDS (PLHIV), supplementary nutrition, awareness and counseling besides facilitating construction of low-cost toilets and access to safe drinking water in urban slums and rural areas.

PROTECTION AND SAFETY

An integral part of all FXBIS programmes is to prevent and reduce all forms of violation and exploitation of children and women which includes gender-based violence, human trafficking, child labour, child marriages, commercial sexual exploitation and incidences of stigma and discrimination within its programme geographies. The ultimate objective is to create a safe, secure and protective environment for women and children.

The FXBIS Protection and Safety strategy focuses on preventive measures through building capacities among adolescents and community members, raise awareness and stakeholder sensitization programmes. FXBIS works with the local youth, girls and boys, to train them as peer educators and build a cadre for agents of change within their own communities. Survivors of violence are assisted through immediate intervention and link with central and state sponsored services for their rehabilitation through referral, after care and counselling services.



REGION WISE PROJECTS UPDATES

PROGRAMMES IN NORTH INDIA

Childline 1098 GautamBudh Nagar, Uttar Pradesh

CHILDLINE 1098 is a 24/7 emergency phone outreach service for children in need of care and protection linking them to emergency and long- term care and rehabilitation services. FXBIS is implementing this project in Gautam Budh Nagar District in the State of **Uttar Pradesh**. During the outbreak of Covid 19 in 2020, FXBIS was nominated as the Nodal agency to work with the district administration in addressing the health crisis situation in the district especially in Noida which is a hub for migrant population. Over 20,000 persons were provided with ration relief and children with emergency support and assistance

SAAMYA (GautamBudh Nagar, Uttar Pradesh)

The project is implemented in three areas of Gautam Budh Nagar district namely Mamura, Desai Gaon and Ghadi Chaukhandi. The objective of the project is to foster young boys towards a gender equitable society by building their understanding on gender through structured training, creating change agents and improving the support systems through advocacy. Under the project, a module has been developed to sensitize boys within the age group of 8-11 years on gender inclusive society.

Railway Platform Children's Programme (Jaipur, Rajasthan)

FXBIS is running a day-care center for children living in the platform and adjacent street of the Jaipur Railway station. The center is situated near the Jaipur railway station where children come to rest, eat, clean, play and learn in a protective environment. The goal of the program is to improve the living conditions of street children living in Jaipur Railway station and to empower them to lead a life of dignity. However, due to Covid 19 outbreak, the day care center had to be kept closed abiding by the national and state protocols, leading to shift in the execution of project activities. The project team visited the children in their living areas to provide them educational support and nutrition. Project team cooked food themselves and distributed amongst children during lunch time. Also, 346 families were provided with dry ration kits and dry milk for infants.

Surkaksha Sustainable Learning Program (SSLP): Strengthen capacity of law enforcement agencies to effectively combat human trafficking in Madhya Pradesh

FXB India Suraksha with the support of British High Commission, Delhi implemented this project in Madhya Pradesh. The objective of the project is to enable proactive and efficient state law enforcement responses and interventions to combat human trafficking in the state. In the process, Over 428 Police officials of the rank of Sub Inspector and Constables consisting both male and female police officials' capacities were strengthened on human trafficking and child protection.



PROGRAMMES IN NORTHEAST & EAST INDIA

Women Empowerment through Holistic Rural Development Project, Ri-Bhoi District, Meghalaya & Assam

FXB is implementing 3 Women empowerment through Holistic Rural Development projects that is one in Ri-Bhoi District of Meghalaya State, one in Kamrup District and one in Darrang District of Assam State. The goal of this is to help poor tribal and backward communities to improve their standard of living and thereby achieve the inclusive and integrated development of targeted villages. FXBIS is implementing this programme with financial support of HDFC Bank CSR with core interventions on livelihoods, education, health, new and renewable energy and infra development. These 3 women empowerment projects are engaged in holistic development of 17 villages in total.

School Sanitation Project (ITC), Assam

FXBIS has joined hands with ITC CSR in 2020 April to implement its flagship programme namely school sanitation programme in 2 districts of Assam viz. Kamrup rural and Darrang. The programme is implemented in 22 schools in 18 revenue villages spread across 3 blocks. The goal of the school WASH project is to help children realize their full potential of development through improved WASH and Health practices in schools with enhanced community support.

Mukti Programme (Pan India with detailed focus in Manipur, West Bengal and Delhi)

FXBIS is implementing Mukti project in Manipur to reduce the incidence of trafficking in persons in India. The purpose of the project is to reduce the incidence of trafficking in persons for commercial sexual exploitation, particularly of children, in trafficking source and Destination states (Manipur, West Bengal and Delhi) of India.

Childline 1098 Ukhrul, Manipur)

CHILDLINE 1098 is a 24/7 emergency phone outreach service for children in need of care and protection linking them to emergency and long-term care and rehabilitation services. FXBIS is implementing this project in Ukhrul district of Manipur state.

Combatting Trafficking in Persons in North India

FXBIS with the support of US Embassy, Delhi is implementing this project in three districts of Uttar Pradesh-Gautam Budh Nagar, Meerut and Ghaziabad. It aims to train around 150 police officials to efficiently address the issue of human trafficking. In this regard FXBIS developed a Hindi translated anti-TIP law enforcement training module/handbook to be used by UP Police for effective intervention and investigation of trafficking cases.



PROGRAMMES IN SOUTH INDIA

Care and Support for People Living with HIV/AIDS (PLHA)

A comprehensive care, treatment and support project is implemented for people living with HIV/AIDS and their families in **Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh**. This project is benefiting 82 HIV/AIDS affected families during the reporting period. A group of affected women are running Mutually Aided Co-operative Society (MACS) offering financial services to help them establish small businesses and make additional earnings.

FXBIS Integrated Rural Development Programme, Villupuram District, Tamilnadu

FXBIS is implementing its Core project helping poor rural households to improve their socio-economic status and improved access to welfare & development scheme offered by various Government Department for socially and economically backward communities in the selected 5 villages of **Villupuram District in Tamilnadu**.

Comprehensive Children Development Programme through Transforming Government Schools(Integrated Community Development Programme), Pondicherry

This project is being implemented in 5 Schools in rural **Pondicherry** covering 1378 children. The objective of this project is to improve the basic amenities and provide learning friendly environment in local Government run schools and also groom soft skills among children of these schools. This project also engaged in desilting of local water channel benefiting thousands of farmer and villagers for irrigation and to recharge ground water. In addition team is engaged with Govt. Health Department and other local NGO network in fight against Covid-19 during the reporting period





GLIMPSES OF IMPACT 2021-2022

LIVELIHOOD PROMOTION

- FXBIS has provided computer training in Digital Learning Centre and around 116 students were trained on different computer courses like MS Office, DTP, Tally and DCA etc.
- Providing additional facilities to 36 shop keepers to improve their sales and by improving their income at Pahamrinai Highway market. Income of the shopkeepers has been increased by 50% after renovation of the market area.
- 4 Agriculture Resource Centres (ARCs) have been Constructed at 4 villages, these centre are functioning as an information dissemination centre also promoting collective farming, modern agricultural practices. Around 150 farmers are benefitted from the ARCs, Agriculture tools and Rice huller.
- 18 Veterinary camps have been organized in 11 villages and around 1175 families have received vaccine, medicine and advice from Livestock Experts for their livestock animals, birds.
- 203 farmers have been linked with district agriculture department and availed paddy seeds and manure in subsidized prize.
- 35700 Face Masks have been produced by our 5 tailoring beneficiaries and have earned about Rs. 4000 each in every month.
- Successfully conducted 10 batches decorative painting trainings in two blocks in Darrang District, where 200 young women and men trained as professional painters in just 5 months and more than 100 are engaging in painting works.
- 25 non-conventional outlets opened in two blocks in Darrang to promoting women entrepreneurs and making them self-reliant.
- FXBIS project Indradhanush has broken the myth that painting works can be done by only men by empowering rural women to emerge as professional painters and more than 100 women have started new journey as painters and taken up painting as a profession.
- The FXBIS team has conducted meetings with 50 Village organizations and discussed in detail regarding the project and its objectives. The meetings were conducted with 1866 SHG women from 50 villages.

- 15 Women Farmers practicing improved farm practices in vegetable cultivation by using Trellis & Mulching in 10 acres in seven project villages – HRDP, Darrang – Assam.
- 50 rural women improved their weaving skills and value added to their traditional weaving activity with the support of HDFC Parivartan. FXBIS established weaving workshop to the weavers where they can get trainings, marketing linkages, tools etc and provide looms and jacquard machines.
- 28 rural marginalised women being supported poultry farming and able to earn good income in very first attempt.
- 28 women are practicing scientific goat rearing management - HDFC Banks under Parivartan initiative constructed 7 mini goat farms for 28 women and provide Assam hill bread goats in all seven HRDP project villages - Darrang – Assam.
- 10 Farmers are supported scientific magur rearing activity.
- 8 Agriculture resource centers are serving as information dissemination centre providing instant access to farmers to latest information available in the field of agriculture, to motivate to the farmers, guide, assist and support in the all ways and have access the line departments like agriculture, Animal Husbandry, KVK and fisheries by making available information about agriculture schemes. As well as to providing frequent usage agriculture tools for the farmers who are not have those minimum facilities. More than 750 farmers have been able to receive the services.
- 9 Farmers Training on Agricultural Productivity Programme and 4 Exposure Visits for farmers has conducted from where 404 farmers have been benefitted by receiving Trainings from Specialists of Krishi Vigyan Kendra and Agriculture Department, Darrang and where they were exchanged their knowledge among them also.
- 170 Mtrs irrigation channel has been constructed and more than 7 00 Bighas (233 acres) land comes under irrigation and more than 200 farmers benefitted through this initiative in HRDP Darrang dist. of Assam.





ACCESS TO QUALITY EDUCATION

- A total of 49 school & centre dropout students were counselled among 71.
- A total of 36 parent meetings were conducted throughout the year online and offline modes at all three designated centres, Garhi Chaukhandi, Basai, and Mamura to inform parents about the enrolment of children, introducing peer educators, and module sessions related to bringing changes in their behaviours.
- A total of 91 module session and revisions has finished with both old and new children of 3 centres.
- This year a total of 345 home or field visits have finished with parents, stakeholders, shopkeepers, etc at all the 3 centres.
- Children from the centres also participated in the art/crafts activities. Hence, 108 activities have been done so far in which children made 1 Bluetooth speaker with LED from waste material.
- Our educator continuously provided educational classes and art & craft to children even during the Covid. During this Covid children attended educational classes through online mode and also learn about drawing paintings and drawings. These classes were run completely during the whole year. Informative sessions were also organized by the facilitator.
- FXBIS have started commercializing the Digital Learning Centre in Ribhoi of Meghalaya and around 116 students were trained on different computer courses like MS Office, DTP, Tally and DCA etc.
- 420 students were provided with supplementary educational support in 14 villages and children are given competency-based teaching through centre and home visits in Darrang dist of Assam and Ribhoi Dist of Meghalaya.
- FXBIS with the support of HDFC Bank's Parivartan refurbished 9 Anganwadi centres in 9 HRDP project villages in Assam and Meghalaya. Around 250 children accessing the facilities with happy smiles.
- FXBIS has refurbished (Floor, roof, toilets, Hand washing platforms, electricity) 9 schools in 9 HRDP intervention villages with the objective of create the child friendly environment in Govt. run schools. Around 600 children benefiting through this initiative.
- Completed 20 Trainings with Matrigoot members and covered 560 beneficiaries. Matrigoot members attended training from 20 school reg. improved kitchen garden.
- Conducted 2 Operation and Maintenance trainings with SMDC/Matrigoot/School HM reg. operating and maintained of WASH facilities. Covered 98 participants.
- Team conducted 20 child cabinet meetings and covered 347 child cabinet members. Training about the role and responsibility of CC members.
- Team conducted 2 stakeholder sensitization programs for intervention school to discuss regarding the intervention and their role and responsibility towards school. Covered 87 participants.
- Under ITC Mission sunhera kal program we have renovated 28 schools and 18 AWCs in Assam



IMPROVED HEALTH STATUS

- 80 families of people living with HIV/AIDS received dry ration kits through FXBIS care and support center in Visakhapatnam.
- 395 People Living with HIV/AIDS (PLHIVs) received care and treatment service through FXBIS Care and Support center in Visakhapatnam
- Around 15 Nutrition and Health sessions were organized online with 100 children and at DCDIC with children. During these sessions, the facilitator explained to the children the benefits of good health and good nutrition.
- Renovating the PHC through various hardware activities under the three major buckets of Infrastructure & Ambiance, Facilities, equipment's & instruments and Safety and Protection.
- Mobilized 3 units of RO plant worth Rs. 2.55 lacs from Eureka Forbes to be installed for Government Higher Secondary School, Kalitheerthalkuppam, Pondicherry. A total of 850 school children will get potable & safe water for drinking.
- Construction of new 6 washing platforms with bathing and changing rooms and platforms are being used by the communities in 4 villages in Ribhoi Dist. of Meghalaya.
- 1 water source mainstreaming, 1 pipeline connection, 3 water tank establishment and 40 public water taps have been renovated at 4 villages to strengthening the drinking water resources in Ribhoi Dist. Of Meghalaya.
- 3 health camps have been organized in 3 villages, 103 beneficiaries has got free health check-up, medicine and counselling.
- 96 identified patients have been referred to Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences (PIMS) for medical consultancy and further treatments.
- 12 AN and PN mothers were followed up for regular check-up and vaccination with the support of VHN and Anganwadi workers in both Nesal and Vilvanatham villages.
- To provide safe drinking water to the community HDFC bank under Parivartan constructed two communities managed safe drinking water plant 2000ltr per hour capacity in two project villages – Akalibari & Kumarpara- Darrang - Assam.
- FXBIS persistent effort to provide basic infrastructural facilities (Community Washing Facilities) has made the lives of people Udmari and Kumarpara.
- Renovation has been done in BPHC Jaljali so that patients can access a better health care system. We have renovated the waiting area, toilets, painted the whole BPHC, fixed fencing nets, beatification done in the garden area. Materials have been provided i-e 3seater bench, dressing trolley, almirah, office table, hospital bed sheet pillow.
- Conducted 24 Menstrual Hygiene Management meetings with adolescents' girls and covered 636 participants. Team discusses about the hygiene practice during Menstrual cycle.
- Team completed 18 wall paintings for BCC three themes for creating awareness among community people. The themes are: Uses of toilet and hand washing with soap, Safe drinking water practices, Surrounding cleanliness.



PROTECTION AND SAFETY

- 129 positive interactions between the sexes and training with 66 boys on gender equality have been done this year.
- total 3310 people were reached with message of child safety and human trafficking through community media awareness program.
- Total of 19 children clubs were activated during the reporting period with total members of 247 children.
- A total of 39 cases were handled by Childline team, the cases include children in conflict with law, child sexual abuse, COVID 19 assistance seeking cases and cases of children in need of care and protection.
- With 103 awareness outreach programs 3939 children and adult could be reached with child safety message.



OTHER ACTIVITIES

- Independence Day, children's day, new year's celebration, republic day, and women's day were the major events that have been celebrated at the 3 centres with children.
- During this period, some major events were organized at DCDIC and in the field i.e., Teacher's Day, Children's Day, Global Handwashing Day, Republic Day, International Women's Day, etc.
- Done needs assessment survey in old post office area, Visakhapatnam for Vedanta Ltd.
- Installed 2 HP surface solar water pump for 15Bighas of land comes under irrigation facility as well 10 farmers getting benefiting through this initiative.
- Installed 70 integrated solar street lights to illuminating seven HRDP project villages – Darang – Assam.



COVID INTERVENTIONS IN 2021-2022

- A total of 873 COVID related activities including immunization work and awareness program through vaccination-related videos has been finished.
- During the Covid lockdown, we distributed dry nutrition food to 50 families and cooked food to 4800 individuals, also we distributed sanitizer to 300 Children, RPF, Govt Schools, and parents and made them aware of the prevention of Covid.
- During the Covid, everyone was locked in their homes and children were the most vulnerable group. At that time, we provided 38 individual and group psychological counselling sessions with the children.
- Covid19 immunization awareness banner placed in Pondicherry city.
- Hand over the 30 oxygen concentrators 6 ICU cots and ventilator through the hands of Honourable Chief Minister of Puducherry Mr Rangasamy in the presence of Health Secretary Dr Arun to fight covid in the UT.
- CAC jointly with FXBIS the pilot project two-month vaccine readiness related project during month of July & August. The pilot project three-way things one is vaccine readiness, Social protection, NCD camp through reach 2500 people each project. 1100 PPE kit, 400 face shield and 72000 sanitizers handed over to the Pondicherry Chief minister Mr. Rangasamy.
- 63 COVID 19 vaccination camps, which include both awareness spreading as well as administering vaccination jabs, were conducted in Ukhrul district and total of 1925 persons were vaccinated with COVID 19 vaccine.

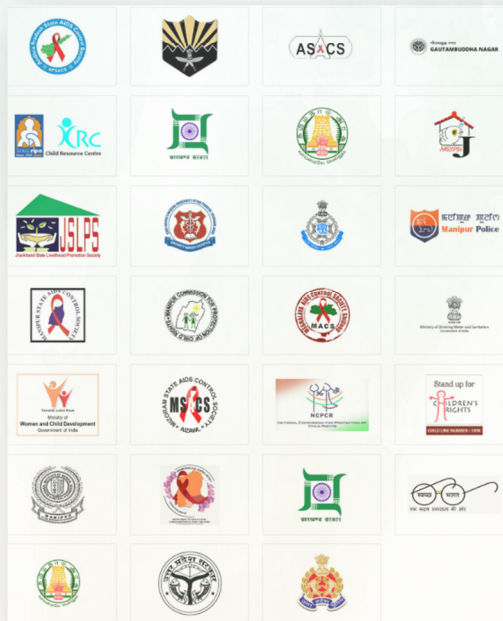

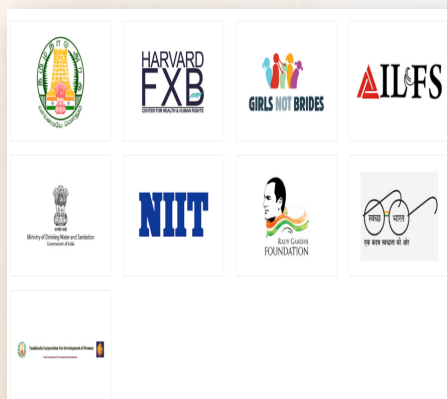

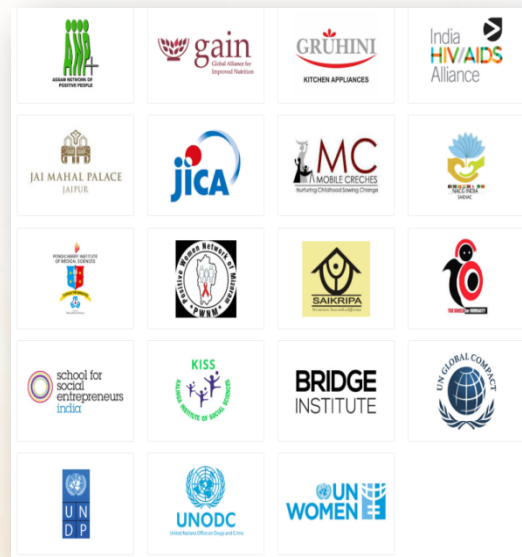
